Course content

The course provides advanced knowledge of second language acquisition and bilingual development. It highlights second language and bilingualism research, growth and development. Key theories, questions and methods are exemplified and discussed. Students will read, analyze and critically evaluate research papers and dissertations in the field and explain and discuss their overall orientations to research problems, their results and their further implications.

Learning outcomes

In order to pass the course, students are expected to be able to:

- describe the overarching issues and central theoretical points in research related to second language acquisition and bilingual development,
- reflect, analyze and discuss research papers and dissertation in the subject area,
- discuss and critically examine second language research problems, results and implications.

Education

Instruction consists of lectures and seminars. Attendance of at least 60% of all teaching sessions is mandatory. The language of instruction is English.

Forms of examination

- a. The course is examined through oral presentation of research papers and dissertation texts, as well as a

take-home examination.

The oral element of the module is assessed only as G or U. The principles for weighting individual course assignments are described in the grading criteria.

Examination is in English and / or Swedish by agreement.

b. Grades will be set according to a seven-point scale related to the learning objectives of the course:

A = Excellent

B = Very good

C = Good

D = Satisfactory

E = Adequate

Fx = Inadequate

F = Totally Inadequate

The oral element of the module is assessed only as G or U.

c. Students will be informed of the written grading criteria when the course starts.

d. In order to pass the course, students must receive a grade of G for oral presentation and a minimum grade of E on the take-home examination, and have been present at 60% of teaching sessions. If a student misses more than 40% of teaching sessions, s/he may take the course again or catch up on missed lesson times (up to 60% attendance) in the next course.

e. At least two examination opportunities should be offered during the semester for each course. At least one examination opportunity should be offered during a semester when the course is not given. Students with a grade of G for the oral presentation and a grade of E for the examination may not retake the examination for higher grades. Students given the grade Fx or F on the examination twice in a row by the same examiner are entitled to have another examiner appointed at the next examination, unless there are special reasons to the contrary. Requests for this should be made to the Departmental Board.

f. Completion of a take-home exam may be allowed if the student is close to a passing grade. The student will be notified, where appropriate, of any additional requirements by the teacher. Adequate corrections of flaws related to understanding – minor misunderstandings, minor inaccuracies or overly limited arguments – will not be awarded more than a grade D. Adequate corrections of simple mistakes related to formatting will be graded using the grades A-E.

Interim

When the syllabus is discontinued, students have the right to be examined according to this syllabus once per semester during a transition period of three semesters.
