Course content

The course aims to provide knowledge about bilingualism and multilingualism at individual level from a psychological, neurolinguistic and cognitive perspective.

Here the course covers models for bilingual language storage and language processing, and these are studied in the light of phenomena such as second language acquisition/learning, language choice, language separation, language loss (attrition) and language pathological phenomena (e.g. aphasia and dementia), learning age, maturity restrictions and critical period (s), as well as individual factors such as language aptitude and motivation. Cognition and bilingualism are treated with respect to the relationship between language and thought, conceptual transfer, and general cognitive skills (such as executive control).

Learning outcomes

In order to pass the course, students are expected to be able to:

- Discuss and problematize the basic concepts of psycho- and neurolinguistics from an acquisitional and bilingual perspective
- Describe and discuss theories of language storage and language processing in bilinguals
- Describe the factors that can influence second language acquisition, language choice and language separation, loss of language (as a result of attrition and pathology in the brain) and critically discuss and illustrate the

phenomena from a multilingual perspective

- Describe and critically discuss the role of age, language aptitude and motivation in language acquisition, and describe and discuss the theories of the neurological correlates of these phenomena
- Describe and critically discuss theories about the relationship between language and thought, and account

for documented differences between monolinguals 'and bi

-/multilinguals' cognition of reality (e.g. perception of events, colours, time, etc.), as well as any differences in linguistic and other cognitive skills.

Education

Instruction consists of lectures and seminars. Attendance of at least 60% of all teaching sessions is mandatory.

The language of instruction is Swedish and / or English.

Forms of examination

a. The examination is by take-home exam.

b. Grades will be set according to a seven-point scale related to the learning objectives of the course:

A = Excellent

B= Very good

C = Good

D = Satisfactory

E = Adequate

Fx = Inadequate

F = Totally Inadequate

- c. Students will be informed of the written grading criteria when the course starts.
- d. In order to pass the course, students must receive a grade of E on the take-home examination and meet the attendance requirements (60%). If a student misses than 40% of teaching sessions, s/he may take the course again or catch up on missed lesson times (up to 60% attendance) the next time the course is offered.
- e. At least two examination opportunities should be offered during the semester each time the course is offered.

At least one examination opportunity should be offered during a semester when the course is not given. Students who receive a grade of E may not retake the examination for a higher grade. Students rated Fx or F on an examination twice in a row by the same examiner are entitled to have another examiner appointed at the next test, unless there are specific reasons against it. Requests for this should be made to Department Board.

f. The completion in order to convert the grade Fx into a passing grade of the take-home exam may be permitted if the student is close to meeting the criteria for a passing grade. The student will be notified, where appropriate, of any additional requirements by the teacher. Adequate corrections of flaws related to understanding – minor misunderstandings, minor inaccuracies or overly limited arguments – will not be awarded more than a grade D. Adequate corrections of simple mistakes related to formatting will be graded using the grades A-E.

Interim

When the syllabus is discontinued, students have the right to be examined according to this syllabus once per semester during a transition period of three semesters.
