Course content

Unit 1. Degree essay includes essay seminars, 15 credits.

An independently carried-out essay about a linguistic, literary, cultural-historical or inter disciplinary subject. It includes a seminar common to all specializations. The degree essay to be carried out with a knowledge of and agreement to the norms of current research ethics.

Unit 2. Lectures, 0 credits.

A look into current research and debate within the field.

Compulsory attendance at at least 3 lectures.

The course is useful for those who want to deepen their subject competence in Polish as well as gain a certain experience of scientific work.

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course the

- show ability to be able to search, collect, evaluate and critically interpret relevant information in an approach to a problem within the main field of study for the education.
- show the ability to be able to independently identify, draft and solve problems from the knowledge of applicable methods within the field as well as completing the degree project within the given period of time.
- show the ability to both orally and written report and give an account of both the reason for the degree project and the result.
- observe the norms of current research ethics.

Education

Instruction is given in the form lectures and seminars. The form and extent of the training may be adjusted

according to the number of students in the course as well as to the economic situation of the Department.

Forms of examination

a. Assessment is based on the Degree project/opposition/compulsory attendance/written assignments. b. Grades are given according to a criterion referenced seven-point scale: A=Excellent, B=Very Good,

C=Good, D=Satisfactory, E=Adequate, Fx=Insufficient, F=Fail

c. The assessment criteria for the course will be distributed at the beginning of the course. A student who has received a grade of E or higher may not take the test again in order to get a higher grade.

A student who has received the grade of Fx or F twice on a given test and by the same examiner can, on application, be granted a new examiner, unless there are specific reasons against it. The application should be addressed to the Board of the department.

Limitations

This course may not be included in a degree together with a course, taken in Sweden or elsewhere, of identical or partially similar content.
