Course content

The course gives basic knowledge of Korean language and culture, the writing system, morphology and syntax, some practical conversational skill, and basic knowledge about modern Korean history, politics and economics as well as contemporary culture and business.

Apart from the textbooks five modern Korean films will be shown.

Learning outcomes

In order to pass the course, students are expected to be able to:

(Introduction to the Study of the Korean Language and Culture)

give an account for the main features in the modern history of Korea, its culture and society

(Modern Standard Korean 1)

- read and write the alphabetical script hangul and conform to the phonetic rules

(Modern Standard Korean 2)

- give an account for the basic grammar of Korean as well as acquired the vocabulary of the course

(Conversation Practice 1)

- show functional control over basic every day language by using grammar and vocabulary

Education

Instruction for all modules is given in the form of lectures and group assignements. The module Introduction to the Study of the Korean Language and Culture also contain a visit to a museum. Attendance at all teaching sessions is mandatory. For more detailed information, please refer to the course description.

Forms of examination

a. Introduction to the Study of the Korean Language and Culture is examined on the basis of a written exam and written assignements. The principles for weighting individual course assignements are described in the grading criteria.

Modern Standard Korean 1 is examined on the basis of a written exam.

Modern Standard Korean 2 is examined on the basis of a written exam.

Conversation Practice 1 is examined on the basis of a listening comprehension and an oral exam. The principles for weighting individual course assignments are described in the grading criteria. For more detailed information, please refer to the course description.

- b. Grades will be set according to a seven-point scale related to the learning objectives of the course, A = Excellent, B = Very good, C = Good, D = Satisfactory, E = Adequate, Fx = Inadequate, F = Totally inadequate.
- c. Students will be informed of the written grading criteria when the course starts. The grading criteria are binding.
- d. In order to pass the course, students must receive the grade E or higher on all examinations and meet the attendance requirements of at least 80%. Under special circumstances, the examiner may, after consulting with the coordinating teacher, grant the student an exemption from the attendance requirements. The student can then be assigned a compensatory assignement. The letter grades A-E are converted into numbers 5-1 and aggregated to an average grade, which is calculated by weighting the numbers of higher education credits of each course unit. The final course grade thus constitutes a weighted average of the course units. Standard rules for rounding numbers apply.
- e. At least two examination opportunities should be offered for each course. At least one examination opportunity should be offered during a semester when the course is not given. Students who receive the grade E or higher may not retake the examination to attain a higher degree. Students who receive the grade Fx or F twice by the same examiner are entitled to have another examiner appointed for the next examination, unless there are special reasons to the contrary. Such requests should be made to the department board.
- f. This course does not include any opportunities to complete a supplementary assignement in order to convert the grade Fx into a passing grade.

The grading criteria for the course are to be distributed at the beginning of the course.

In order to obtain at least a grade of E, a student who has received an F or Fx has the right to an additional four

tests provided the course is still offered. A student who has received a grade of E or higher may not take the test

again in order to get a higher grade. A student who has received the grade of Fx or F twice on a given test and by

the same examiner can, on application, be granted a new examiner, unless there are specific reasons against it.

The application should be addressed to the board of the department.

Interim

When the syllabus is discontinued, students have the right to be examined according to this syllabus once per semester during a transition period of three semesters.

Limitations

This course may not be included in a degree together with a course, taken in Sweden or elsewhere, of identical or partially similar content.
