#### **Course content**

The course consists of three part courses: Part course 1: Theory and elementary methodology (7,5 ECTS). Part course 2: Additional studies (7,5 ECTS). Scientific essay (15 ECTS). The aim of the course is to give students a fundamental knowledge of relevant theoretical and methodological approaches related to the subject filed of children's culture. The student will practice and develop the ability to work independently with a limited scientific problem as well as presenting it in a scientific essay.

#### Learning outcomes

Having completed the course the student will be able to demonstrate the ability to, in writing as well as orally, present and integrate theoretical and methodological knowledge of relevance to the subject field of children's culture. Furthermore the student will be able to seek, assess and critically judge relevant information as well as independently identify, formulate and carry out a research problem within a scientific essay. The student is expected to observe the appropriate principles of research ethics. Each student will also critically evaluate, as well as conduct a constructive discussion on, another scientific essay.

#### Education

The course consists of lecturers, seminars and guidance of a scientific essay. The extent and design of the course may be adjusted to the number of students registered on the course as well as to the financial situation of the institution. Please notice that all lectures are in Swedish.

#### Forms of examination

a) The following methods of examinations are used: individually written hand-in assignments and oral presentations (part course 1 and 2) and a scientific essay (part course 3).

b) Grades are given according to a criterion referenced seven-point scale: A= Excellent B= Very good C= Good D= Satisfactory E= Adequate Fx= Insufficient F= fail

c) The grading criteria for this course are to be distributed at the beginning of the course.

d) A grade of at least E on all modules is required in order to obtain a grade for the

whole course

e) In order to obtain at least a grade of E, a student who has received an F or Fx has the right to an additional four tests provided the course is still offered. A student who has received a grade of E or higher may not take the test again in order to get a higher grade. A student who has received the grade of Fx or F twice on a given test and by the same examiner can, on application, be granted a new examiner, unless there are specific reasons against it. The application should be addressed to the board of the department.

# Interim

When the course is no longer offered or its contents have been essentially revised, the student has the right to be examined according to this course syllabus once per semester for a three-semester period. However, the restrictions above under "Forms of examination" still hold.

For information about transitional rules for courses in the older pre-Bologna system the

student counselor or director of studies at the Centre for the studies of children's culture should be contacted.

# Limitations

This course cannot at the same time be included in a degree where a student has concluded and passed a course where the content is in total or in part equivalent with the content of this course.
