Course content

The course prepares the student for academic work at a university or other research location, government office or company. The course aims to improve the productive abilities (oral and written Korean) with a special reference to participation in seminars and conferences related to Korea. The student is trained in communicating orally and in writing for academic work, as well as for other professional duties with literature and source material in Korean. The course also aims at improving the student's ability to use academic Korean to compile research results as well as presentations and discussions.

Learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the student should demonstrate an ability to:

- present his/her research in Korean writing according to the norms of the chosen research area,
- present and discuss, in Korean, a text of the chosen research area in an academic or corporate environment.

Education

Instruction is given in the form of lectures and seminars.

Attendance at all teaching sessions is mandatory.

Language of instruction is English.

Forms of examination

a) The course is examined on the basis of by 2-3 written assignments, an oral presentation and a discussion of

an academic publication or other scientific publication during a seminar. The system of grading and relating the separate examination assignments among them, is accounted for in the grading criteria. For more detailed information, see the course description.

b) Grading is done according to a goal oriented seven tiered scale: A = Excellent, B = Very good, C = Good, D = Satisfactory, E = Sufficient, Fx = Insufficient, F = Completely insufficient.

c. The written grade criteria are communicated to the students at the beginning of the course.

d. In order to get a final grade at the entire course the student needs a grade E or higher on the written assignments, the oral presentation and discussion, as well as at least 80% attendance. In the case of specific circumstances, the examiner and the responsible teacher may give the student admission to be absent from parts of the compulsory teaching. The student may in such cases get a supplementary assignment.

e. At least two examination sessions will be available during each semester in which the course is given. At least one examination session will be offered in the semester or year during which the course is not given. Students who have received a grade E or higher may not re-take the examination to get a higher grade. Students that have received the grade of Fx or F twice on an examination by the same examiner have the right to be assigned another examiner for grading the next examination, unless there are specific reasons against it. Such request must be made to the Departmental Board.

f. Doing a supplementary examination in order to raise an Fx to a passing grade is not possible in this course.

Interim

If the course is no longer given or if the course content has changed significantly the student has the right to be examined according to this syllabus once per semester during a three semester period.

Misc

This course can not be included in the degree of another passed course taken inside or outside the country, of which the contents in whole or in part are agreeable with the contents of this course.
