#### Course content

-The relationship between evidence based methods and knowledge of helping relations in psychiatry and social work with emphasis on social psychiatry and addiction treatment

-Discourses on professionalism

-The importance of context for professional helping relations

-The components and dynamics of professional helping relations.

#### Learning outcomes

Upon successful completion of the course students shall be able to

-describe and discuss the relationship between evidence based methods and knowledge of helping relations in social psychiatry, the social services and addiction treatment

-present and discuss discourses on professionalism

-critically reflect on the components and dynamics of professional helping relations.

#### Education

Instruction is in the form of lectures and seminars with active student participation. Participation in seminars according to teacher instructions; non-attendance at seminars to be compensated for according to teacher instructions.

#### Forms of examination

Attendance at examination seminars is obligatory. Examination seminars and theme papers are graded as Pass or Fail. Examination by individual take-home assignment is graded according to a seven-step scale related to the specified learning outcomes:

AExcellentoutstanding performance

BVery goodabove average standard but with some errors

CGoodgenerally sound work but with a number of notable errors

DSatisfactoryfair but with significant shortcomings

ESufficientperformance meets the minimum criteria

FxFailsome more work required before the credit can be awarded

FEailcompletely unacceptable performance

Information on grading criteria and forms of examination is handed out at the start of the course. To pass students must have obtained at least grade E on written assignments and satisfied other demands of the course.

For information on examination and make up examination regulations as approved by the Board of the Department of Social Work, see separate information sheet.

Students have the right to request re-examination with another examiner if failed twice on the course. Such requests must be made in writing to the director of studies no later than one year after the course is concluded.

Plagiarism and other attempts to mislead (e.g. self-plagiarism) at examinations or other assessments of study achievement will result in reporting for suspected cheating, which can lead to disciplinary measures. Examination task with graded assessment: an individual take-home assignment.

Further demands of the course:

Participation in seminars in accordance with teacher instructions. Failure to attend any seminar must be compensated for according to teacher instructions.
