Course content

This course provides an introduction to the learning environments and explorative approaches of Swedish preschools. Preschools are highlighted as a venue for children's participation and influence in relation to children's rights.

The course provides insight into the development and philosophy of Swedish preschools, with links between the view on children, learning, play, care, and childhood conditions. In addition, the course includes study visits to preschools and other institutions and activities for children.

Learning outcomes

Upon completion of the course, students are expected to be able to:

- give an account of Swedish preschools' social duty, with a focus on the concepts of exploration, learning, play and care;
- discuss and reflect on the pedagogical implications of children's influence and participation, as well as the preschools' core values;
- discuss and analyse different ways of using locations, rooms and materials in learning contexts in order to enable children to explore;
- discuss the environment's practical-aesthetic significance for children's opportunities to explore and play.

Education

Instruction is given in the form of lectures, teacher-led seminars, field studies, group exercises and study visits.

Specific teaching sessions are mandatory. Absence must be compensated for as described in the course description.

Forms of examination

a) Forms of examination

The course is examined on the basis of:

EXA1 Oral group presentation, 2 credits

EXA2 Individual paper, 4 credits

b) Grading

The grade on EXA1 will be set according to a two-point scale:

G = Pass

U = Fail

The grade on EXA2 and the final course grade will be set according to a seven-point scale related to the learning objectives of the course:

A = Excellent

B = Very good

C = Good

D = Satisfactory

E = Adequate

Fx = Fail, some additional work required

F = Fail, much additional work required

c) Assessment criteria

The assessment criteria for the course are specified in the course description.

d) Final grade

In order to pass the course, students must receive a passing grade on all examinations and complete all assignments as per the course description. The grade on EXA2 will also be the final grade on the course.

e) Retakes and failing grades

Students who receive the grade E or higher on an examination or assignment may not retake the examination to attain a higher grade. A passing grade cannot be changed to a failing grade at the student's request.

Students who receive the grade Fx have the opportunity to complement the submitted examination task within one week of being informed of the need for complementation (once per examination opportunity). If this is not done within the specified time limit, the student will have to retake the examination.

Students who receive the grade U, Fx or F twice by the same examiner are entitled to have another examiner appointed to determine the grade. Such requests should be made to the relevant director of studies.

Examinations are given twice per semester during the course. In addition, one opportunity to retake an examination is given during a semester or year when the course is not provided. Further details are provided in the course description.

Interim

If this course is discontinued, or its contents are substantially altered, students have the right to be examined according to this syllabus once per semester for three further semesters.

Limitatione

This course may not be included in a degree together with a course, taken in Sweden or elsewhere, of identical or partially similar content.
