Course content

The course contains an introduction to socio-pragmatics theory and method with application to Spanish. Spoken and written language is analysed from a socio-pragmatic perspective, particularly in view of the extralinguistic factors that affect communication and that explain linguistic choices and linguistic variation. Pragmatic phenomena such as social politeness and self-image are given special attention in the course.

Learning outcomes

After completing the course the student should be able to:

- account critically for key concepts and methods in socio-pragmatic studies
- apply the socio-pragmatic theory and methodology to texts and conversations in Spanish
- carry out analysis from a socio-pragmatic perspective and explain the interplay between extralinguistic factors on the one hand and linguistic choices and linguistic variation on the other

• perform an analysis that is presented in a paper written in proper and adequate Spanish; the task should be based on authentic text or dialogue materials and contain a justification of different interpretations

Education

Teaching is given in the form of lessons and tutorials with groups or individually. In the case of low registration numbers or a lack of resources, teaching will take the form of tutorials or individual tutoring.

Forms of examination

b. Grades are given according to a goal related criterion referenced seven-point scale:

d. A grade of at least E on all modules is required in order to obtain a passing grade for the whole course.
