Course content

The course is a freestanding survey course that provides an introduction to some important aspects of Swedish music history up to the present day. The course is based on a series of lectures and seminars on these aspects.

Learning outcomes

After completion of the course, the student will be able to:

- provide a written general overview of the distinguishing features of Swedish music history.
- provide a general overview of certain key perspectives and contexts in Swedish music history.

Education

Instruction is in the form of lectures and seminars. Attendance at seminars and lectures is compulsory. For more detailed information, see the course description.

Forms of examination

a.Examination is in the form of a take-home examination.

The principles for weighing the different examination elements are set out in the grading criteria.

b.Grading is based on a seven-point grading scale specific to the learning objectives of the course:

A = Excellent

B = Very good
C = Good
D = Satisfactory
E = Sufficient
Fx = Fail (Insufficient)
F = Fail (Completely insufficient)

c. Students are informed of the grading criteria in writing at the start of the course.

d. To receive a passing grade for the whole course, the student must have earned at least a grade of E on all examination elements, and have met the attendance requirement for all seminars and lectures. The attendance requirement is considered met if the student has attended at least 60% of the lectures and seminars. If special circumstances exist and following consultation with the responsible teacher, the student may be exempted from the obligation to attend certain compulsory teaching sessions. In such case, the student may be required to complete a supplementary assignment.

e. For each course instance, there must be two examination sessions during that semester. In addition, there must be at least one examination session offered any year no course instance is offered. Students who have earned grade E or higher are not allowed to retake the examination to improve their grade.

Students who have earned grade Fx or F on two examinations in a row by the same examiner are entitled to have a different examiner appointed for the next examination, unless special circumstances dictate otherwise. A request to this effect must be made to the Department Board.

f. Supplementation of an examination element may be permitted if the student is close to obtaining a passing grade. The assignment must be submitted within one week of the examiner informing the student of the need for supplementation. In case of approved supplementation of deficiencies related to comprehension – minor misunderstandings, minor inaccuracies, or somewhat insufficient reasoning – the grade E is used. In case of approved supplementation of simple formalities, the grades A–E can be used.

Students who receive the grade Fx or F on two examinations in a row by the same examiner is entitled to have another examiner appointed for the next examination, unless there are exceptional reasons not to do so. A request in this regard is made to the Department Board.

f. Supplementation of an exam assignment may be permitted if the student is close to a passing grade. The assignment must be handed in within a week of the examiner informing the student of the need for supplementation. Supplementation for shortcomings relating to understanding – minor misunderstandings, small errors, or partly limited arguments – is awarded the grade E. In case of approved supplementation of simple formalities, the grades A–E can be used.

Interim

When the course syllabus is withdrawn, the student is entitled to examination according to the previous course syllabus once per semester for a phase-out period of three semesters.

Limitations

This course may not be credited in the degree at the same time as a course taken and passed in or outside the country if the content of said course corresponds in whole or in part to the content of this course.
