Prerequisites and special admittance requirements

A degree comprising at least 180 credits, including an independent thesis comprising at least 15 credits, as well as English proficiency equivalent to English 6. At least 45 credits within "Master's programme in public health sciences: Societal and individual perspectives".

Course content

With guidance, the student takes part of the work at an organisation, public authority, university department, company or other workplace doing work or research related to public health issues. The aim of the traineeship course is to provide students with work experience within the field of public health sciences. The aim is moreover to give students the opportunity to apply their knowledge and competencies in public health, as well as to increase the understanding of how work or research within the area of public health sciences can be carried out.

Learning outcomes

In order to receive a passing grade on the course, the student should be able to:

- Reflect upon how the activities of the workplace relate to public health sciences.
- Clarify the practical application of knowledge and skills in public health sciences.

Education

The course consists of a supervised traineeship at a workplace conducting work or research related to public health issues. Before the traineeship starts, the workplace, supervisor, and a work plan should be approved by the course manager.

The course language varies depending on the workplace.

See the course description for more detailed information. The course description will be available at least one

month before the course starts.

Forms of examination

a) The course is examined through an individually written report.

The report will be graded on a two-point grading scale (G=Pass, U=Fail).

The examination will be in English.

If the student has a certificate from Stockholm University that recommends special pedagogical support, the examiner has the right to offer the student alternative forms of examination.

b) The course grade will be given on a two-point grading scale:

G = Pass

U = Fail

c) The grading criteria will be presented to the students in writing when the course begins.

d) In order to receive a passing grade in the course, the student must receive a passing grade on the report.

e) Two examinations are offered each time course is taught. For terms when the course is not taught, one examination is offered.

Students who receive a failing grade two consecutive times from the same examiner have the right to request a different examiner to grade the examination. This request should be made to the Director of Studies.

A report that received a failing U grade can receive a passing G grade with submission of a supplementary assignment, if the student is close to passing.

Interim

Students may request an examination in accordance with this syllabus up to three semesters after the course has ceased or changed significantly.

Limitations

The content of this course overlaps with the course "Traineeship in public health sciences" (course code: PH4002) to the extent of 7.5 credits and, therefore, cannot be part of a degree in which "Traineeship in public health sciences" is also included.

Misc

Plagiarism, cheating, and self-plagiarism is prohibited in all parts of the course. Suspicion of such cases is reported to the Disciplinary Board at Stockholm University.

This course is given as part of Term 4 of the Master's programme in public health sciences: Societal and individual perspectives.

Required reading

The current course literature will be published on the department's website, www.su.se/publichealth, at least two months before the course begins.
