Prerequisites and special admittance requirements

180 credits, of which 90 credits in a social sciences major. English 6 and 15 credits from courses at the advanced level in economic history, international relations or equivalent.

Course content

The course is 20 consecutive weeks fulltime and comprises of at least 18 weeks of internship at a public or private authority, corporation or organization.

The overall purpose of the course is to increase the student's employability by giving the students the possibility to apply theoretical knowledge in practice. The intern should therefore in consultation with the employer and supervisor carry out an internship where the student applies subject knowledge in an area of relevance to the labor market.

Learning outcomes

After completed the course the students are expected to be able to:

- plan, execute and in written form present independent assignments, reflecting upon scientific, societal and ethical aspects.
- identify, formulate and solve problems that occur during the internship.
- apply subject knowledge of relevance to the labor market.
- reflect upon the internship and analyse its relation to the student's previous studies, in particular within Global Political Economy, International relations and/or Economic History, as well as in relation to potential career paths and working areas after graduation.

Education

The course consist of mandatory seminars and internship.

The seminar language is English.

Seminars will be held on campus or online, as communicated ahead.

Forms of examination

The course is assessed through:

- mandatory attendance at the host organization during the entire internship period. Additionally the internship must be carried out in alignment with agreements, which should be confirmed by the host organization.
- An internship report that comprises 10-12 pages, written and assessed after by the end of the internship.
- Participation in a mandatory seminar/s whereas the student's internship.
- The course is graded individually in accordance with a two-point scale (G = Passed, F = failed) relating to the learning objectives of the course.

Interim

When the syllabus is discontinued or the content of the course has changed significantly students have the right to be examined according to this syllabus once per semester during a transition period of three semesters (however, this is subject to the limitations related to examination listed above in this course plan).

Limitations

This course may not be included in a degree together with a course, taken in Sweden or elsewhere, of identical or partially similar content.

Misc

- This course may be included in the main field of study Economic History or International Relations.
- The course as a whole comprises 20 weeks full-time, without interruption, of which at least 18 weeks are spent at the internship.
- The internship can be conducted in Sweden and/or another country.
- The internship must be unpaid.
- The course must begin and end within the semester in question.
- The students must search for a suitable internship themselves.
- It is important that the tasks during the internship are of a relevant and advanced nature and relate to the student's social science education.
- The internship must be approved by the course convener in order to qualify for higher education credits. The host organization must provide a supervisor during the internship.
