This syllabus was developed by the Faculty Board of Humanities 2017-09-13 and last revised by the Board of the Department of Linguistics 2018-10-03.

Prerequisites and special admittance requirements

A Degree of 180 ECTS credits within the main field of study or specialisation subject area, including an individual degree project in that area. English 6 or equivalent.

Additional requirements apply for particular specialisations:

For English Linguistics and Applied English Linguistics the degree must include 90 ECTS credits (major) in a discipline related to the specialisation (English Linguistics). Knowledge of English must be documented by an international proficiency test: TOEFL test including TWE with a minimum of 630 (paper) 267 (computer) or 109 (Internet), or Cambridge Certificate of Proficiency with an A or B grade, or IELTS test with a minimum of 7.5 (and no module under 7), or equivalent.

For the specialisations Russian, Polish and Czech, Swedish 3 or equivalent.

For the specialisations Swedish and Scandinavian languages, an individual degree project in Swedish/Scandinavian Language Science. Swedish 3 or equivalent.

For the specialisation Typology and Linguistic Diversity, 90 ECTS credits in General Linguistics, and an individual degree project of 15 ECTS credits or equivalent. The individual degree project of 15 ECTS credits can include separate seminar courses.

Details of entry requirements and specific entry requirements for specialisations accepting qualifications other than the Degree of Bachelor of Arts in the subject area of the main field of study or specialisation:

The specialisation in Swedish as a Second Language requires a degree of 180 ECTS credits or equivalent including an individual degree projekt, or a teacher degree, 90 ECTS credits in Swedish as a Second Language and an individual degree project of 15 ECTS credits in Swedish as a Second Language or another field relevant to the specialisation. Swedish 3 or equivalent.

The specialisation in Bilingualism requires a Degree of 180 ECTS credits, including an individual degree

project in a Language Science discipline or other field relevant to the study route (e.g., pedagogy, psychology or social anthropology) and at least 30 ECTS credits in linguistics.

The specialisation in Language Education requires a Degree of 180 ECTS credits with a major in a Language Science discipline, *or* a Bachelor of Arts in Education with a language major and an individual degree project of at least 15 ECTS credits dealing with a language, language education or equivalent, either as part of the degree or independently. Swedish 3.

Programme structure

The programme comprises four semesters of full-time study and consists of both mandatory and elective courses, of which at least 60 ECTS credits are in the main field of study/specialisation, or for those main fields with contain specialisations, 15 ECTS credits in the main field of study and 45 ECTS credits within the specialisation.

There are twenty specialisations within the programme: Ancient Greek, Baltic Languages, Bilingualism, Czech, English Linguistics, Applied English Linguistics, Finnish, French, German, Italian, Language Education, Latin, Polish, Portuguese, Russian, Scandinavian Languages, Spanish, Swedish, Swedish as a Second Language, and Typology and Linguistic Diversity.

The programme provides in-depth knowledge and skills, and equips students for postgraduate studies in Language Science, or a professional career in a language-related field. The programme welcomes students with a Swedish or international undergraduate degree.

Within the Master's Programme in Language Science, the students will deepen and expand their knowledge in the field of the selected study route. The emphasis varies between specialisations, and may focus, for example, on pragmatics, language history, language documentation or grammar. Importance is also given to the students' development in terms of scientific approach, independent analysis, and skills in presenting their work orally as well as in writing. These competences are trained in seminar presentations and written assignments.

A semester typically consists of four course units of 7.5 ECTS credits. The semester is divided into two halves, such that two courses are taken in parallel in the first half, and two in the second. Courses devoted to developing particular skills may depart from this pattern.

The individual project for a (two-year) Master's degree consists of a full semester's work, 30 ECTS credits.

The programme starts out with two courses that are mandatory to all specialisations: "Language in Use" and "Scientific Methods and Research Ethics", and concludes with the individual degree project in the fourth semester. In the third semester, there are two skill training courses (a total of 15 ECTS credits). Apart from these, each study route has at least two mandatory courses (15 ECTS credits). Of the remaining 45 ECTS credits (or less), at least 15 are to be taken within the main field of study, the specialisation, or the overall profile of the study route, and 15 within another main field of study or specialisation, or outside the profile of the study route. A further mandatory course is "Advanced Academic English", which may make up either one of the skill courses or one of the elective courses, preferably in the third semester. Courses are selected in consultation with the course coordinator of the specialisation.

Allowing for some variation between specialisations, it is possible to go abroad to study or do an internship as part of the programme.

All specialisations lead to a Degree of Master of Arts (120 ECTS credits), with the option of a Degree of Master of Arts (60 ECTS credits) as an intermediate exit point after one year.

The language of instruction for programme-wide courses is English, with an option of taking "Scientific Methods and Research Ethics" in Swedish in those specialisations which require Swedish. For specialisation-specific courses, the language of instruction varies between English, Swedish, and the language studied. For details, please see the course catalogue information for the relevant specialisation.

The Master's Programme in Language Science is given by the Department of Linguistics (the programme host department) in collaboration with the Department of English, the Department of Philosophy, the Department of Slavic, Baltic Languages, Finnish, Dutch and German, the Department of Language Education, the Department of Swedish and Bilingualism, and the Department of Romance Studies and Classics.

In principle, courses should be on the advanced level. A Degree of Master of Arts (120 ECTS credits) may contain a maximum of 30 first-cycle credits, and a Degree of Master of Arts (60 ECTS credits) maximally 15 first-cycle credits.

Regarding specific entrance requirements for courses within the master's programme, please consult the syllabus of the course in question.

To graduate with a one-year Degree of Master of Arts (60 ECTS credits), the first semester is taken as set for the study route. In the second semester, 15 ECTS credits in the elective block will be made up of the Independent Degree Project Course for a one-year Master's degree in the relevant main field of study/specialisation.

Degree

The programme leads to a Degree of Master of Arts (120 ECTS credits) in the main field of study. For specialisations within Romance Studies and Classics, the degree will be in the selected specialisation. It is possible to take a Degree of Master of Arts (60 ECTS credits) as an intermediate exit point after one year.

Misc

Transitional regulations:

When the Programme Education Plan is discontinued, students have a right to complete their education according to this syllabus during a transitional period corresponding to the two-year duration of the programme plus another two years. During this time, reference is made primarily to the limitations stated in the plans for the individual courses within the programme still apply; secondarily, equivalent courses will be offered.
