## Decision

This education plan has been adopted by the Board of the Faculty of Humanities.

## Prerequisites and special admittance requirements

A degree of 180 ECTS credits or equivalent within the main field of study or specialisation subject area, including a degree project in the profile area of the selected study route. English 6 or equivalent.

*Additional requirements apply as follows:*

For the study routes English Linguistics and Applied English Linguistics, proficiency in English must be documented by an internationally recognised test: TOEFL test including TWE with a minimum of 630 (paper), 267 (computer) or 109 (internet) *or* Cambridge Certificate of Proficiency with the grade A or B, *or* an IELTS test with a total of at least 7.5 and no module under 7, or equivalent.

For the study routes Russian, Polish and Czech: Swedish 3 or equivalent.

For the study routes Swedish Language and Scandinavian Languages: a degree project in Swedish Language/Scandinavian linguistics, and Swedish 3 or equivalent.

For the study route Typology and Linguistic Diversity: 90 ECTS credits in General Linguistics including a degree project of 15 ECTS credits or equivalent which may include separate seminar courses and similar activities.

## Details of entry requirements and specific entry requirements for study routes accepting qualifications other than a Degree of Bachelor of Arts or equivalent in the subject area of the main field of study or specialisation:

The study route Swedish as a Second Language requires a degree of 180 ECTS credits or equivalent including an independent degree project, *or* a Bachelor of Arts degree in Education and 90 ECTS credits in Swedish as a Second Language and a degree project/independent project of 15 ECTS credits in Swedish as a Second Language or another field relevant to the study route. Swedish 3 or equivalent.

The study route Bilingualism requires a degree of 180 ECTS credits or equivalent, including a degree project or equivalent in a Language Science discipline or other field relevant to the study route (such as pedagogy, psychology or social anthropology) and at least 30 ECTS credits in Linguistics as part of the degree or

independently.

The study route Language Education requires a degree of 180 ECTS credits or equivalent, including a degree project in a Language Science discipline *or* a Degree of Bachelor of Arts in Education with a language major and an independent (degree) project of at least 15 ECTS credits dealing with a language or language education or equivalent, either as part of the degree or independently. Swedish 3 or equivalent.

### **Programme structure**

The programme comprises four semesters of full-time study and consists of both mandatory and elective courses, of which at least 60 ECTS credits are to be in the main field of study, or, for those main fields which offer specialisations, 15 ECTS credits in the main field and 45 ECTS credits within the specialisation.

There are twenty study routes within the programme: Ancient Greek, Baltic Languages, Bilingualism, Czech, English Linguistics, Applied English Linguistics, Finnish, French, German, Italian, Language Education, Latin, Polish, Portuguese, Russian, Scandinavian Languages, Spanish, Swedish Language, Swedish as a Second Language, and Typology and Linguistic Diversity.

The programme provides in-depth knowledge and skills, and equips students for postgraduate studies in Language Science. It can also serve as the basis for a future professional career in a language-related field. The programme welcomes students with a Swedish or international undergraduate degree.

Within the Master's Programme in Language Science, students will deepen and expand their knowledge in the profile area of the selected study route. The emphasis varies between study routes, and may focus, for example, on pragmatics, language history, language documentation or grammar. Importance is also given to the students' individual development in terms of scientific approach, independent analysis, and skills in presenting their work in writing as well as orally. These competences are trained in activities such as smaller-scale research assignments and seminar presentations.

Each semester typically consists of four course units of 7.5 ECTS credits. The semester is divided into two halves, such that two courses are taken in parallel in the first half, and two in the second. Courses devoted to developing particular skills may depart from this pattern. The degree project for a Degree of Master of Arts (120 credits) constitutes a full semester's work, 30 ECTS credits.

The Master's Programme in Language Science consists of three categories of courses:

***Courses mandatory for all programme students.*** The following courses are mandatory to all study routes: "Language in Use", 7.5 ECTS credits, "Scientific Methods and Research Ethics", 7.5 ECTS credits, and "Advanced Academic English", 7.5 ECTS credits.

***Courses mandatory for the particular study route profile.*** These courses are mandatory for students within a specific study route, constitute further specialisation in the selected profile area and are named in the description of the study route.

***Elective courses.*** These courses contribute both to further specialisation within the selected profile area (courses within the main field of study/specialisation/profile area) and to broadening the profile in the form of complementary studies (courses outside the main field of study/specialisation/profile area). The label "elective courses" does not entail open choice – the description of the study route may specify a set from which courses are to be selected, e.g., "from the courses currently offered at the department of the main field of study".

In those cases where the department of the main field of study offers courses on subjects or topics which clearly depart from the the selected study route, such courses may be recognised as complementary studies. As an example, studies in sign language may be considered complementary to studies in Typology and Linguistic Diversity.

For all courses in the category "Elective courses", there is an amount of variation; in some study routes, the scope for variation is large, in others, a larger number of courses have been specified so that more credits are found in the category "Courses mandatory for the particular study route profile".

Apart from achieving further specialisation by taking courses in the main study profile area and broadening their knowledge through complementary studies, students need to gain experience of using more practical skills in courses focusing on the job market. Such practical training may consist in courses teaching academic writing or statistics, but other themes of relevance to the study route can of course be considered. For that reason, it is recommended that 15 ECTS credits are made up of such courses. It is suggested that these are

taken in the third semester, but depending on the structure of the study route and on available courses, other semesters are possible. As the job market differs between study routes, these courses may count as “Courses mandatory for the particular study route profile” or “Elective courses”, but the course “Advanced Academic English”, mandatory for all programme students, may also count in this category.

### **General programme structure semester by semester**

In *semester one*, two courses mandatory for all programme students are taken in the first half, “Language in Use”, 7.5 ECTS credits and “Scientific Methods and Research Ethics”, 7.5 ECTS credits. In the second half of the semester, two courses mandatory to the selected study profile are usually taken.

In *semester two*, the 30 ECTS credits may consist of elective courses or a combination of elective courses and courses mandatory for the particular study route profile.

In *semester three*, the 30 ECTS credits are distributed across a course mandatory for all programme students, courses mandatory for the particular study profile and elective courses according to the specifications given below for each study route.

*Semester four* consists of a 30 ECTS credits degree project within the profile area of the selected study route. For more details regarding a specific study route, see below under the heading “Courses”.

### **General restrictions on the distribution of credits across the programme**

Generally, credits are distributed between courses mandatory for all programme students, courses mandatory for the particular study profile and elective courses as follows.

***Courses mandatory for all programme students:*** “Language in Use”, 7.5 ECTS credits, “Scientific Methods and Research Ethics”, 7.5 ECTS credits, and “Advanced Academic English”, 7.5 ECTS credits.

***Courses mandatory for the particular study profile:*** Courses in this category are courses specified by name but not part of the category “Courses mandatory for all programme students”. They minimally amount to 30 ECTS credits, i.e., the 30 credit degree project.

***Elective courses:*** Courses amounting to maximally 67.5 ECTS credits. Of these, at least 30 credits are to be taken within the main study area/specialisation (with progressive specialisation) making 60 credits together with the degree project, and at least 15 credits are to be taken in the form of complementary courses. The remaining 22.5 credits may consist of courses within the main area of the study route or of complementary courses, depending on the specifications for the particular study route. To ensure that elective courses are of relevance to the study route, and that they contribute to an education qualifying for a degree, elective courses are always to be selected in consultation with the coordinator for the study route in question.

### **Master’s Degree (120 credits) and Master’s Degree (60 credits)**

All study routes lead to a Degree of Master of Arts of 120 ECTS credits. A Degree of Master of Arts (120 credits) requires 60 ECTS credits within the main field of study (including a Master’s degree project of 30 ECTS credits) for fields of study without specialisations, while fields with specialisations require 15 ECTS credits in the main field of study and 45 ECTS credits in the area of the specialisation (including a Master’s degree project of 30 ECTS credits).

In study routes which state it, an intermediate exit point is available in the form of a one-year Degree of Master of Arts (60 credits). A Degree of Master of Arts (60 credits) requires 30 ECTS credits in the main field of study (including a Master’s degree project of 15 ECTS credits) for fields of study without specialisations, while fields with specialisations require 7.5 ECTS credits in the main field of study and 22.5 ECTS credits in the area of the specialisation (including a Master’s degree project of 15 ECTS credits).

Students who have completed a (one-year) Degree of Master of Arts (60 credits) may continue on to complete a (two-year) Degree of Master of Arts (120 credits).

### **Further on the structure of the programme**

Allowing for some variation between study routes, it is possible to go abroad to study or do an internship as part of the programme.

Part-time study (50% pace) is possible within those study routes that have specified it under “Courses” below.

The language of instruction for programme-wide courses is English, with the option of taking “Scientific Methods and Research Ethics” in Swedish in those study routes which require Swedish. For study route-specific courses, the language of instruction varies between English, Swedish, and the language studied. For details, refer to the information for the relevant study route in the course catalogue.

The Master’s Programme in Language Science is given by the Department of Linguistics (the programme host department) in collaboration with the Department of English, the Department of Philosophy, the Department of Slavic, Baltic Languages, Finnish, Dutch and German, the Department of Language Education, the Department of Swedish Language and Multilingualism, and the Department of Romance Studies and Classics.

- demonstrate an ability to present their work clearly, both in speech and writing, and to discuss the conclusions along with the knowledge and reasoning underpinning them, both nationally and internationally, in dialogue with different audiences,
- demonstrate the competence and skills required to participate in research and development work, or to meet

the demands of other highly qualified occupations

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For information about elective courses, please contact the study counsellor in the department giving the study route in question.

In principle, courses should be on the second-cycle (advanced) level. A Degree of Master of Arts (120 ECTS credits) may contain a maximum of 30 first-cycle credits, and a Degree of Master of Arts (60 ECTS credits) maximally 15 first-cycle credits.

Regarding specific entrance requirements for courses within the master's programme, please consult the syllabus of the course in question.

To graduate with a one-year Degree of Master of Arts (60 ECTS credits), the first semester is taken as set for the study route. In the second semester, 15 ECTS course credits in the elective block will be made up of the degree project course for a one-year Master's degree in the relevant main field of study/specialisation.

### **Degree**

The programme leads to a Degree of Master of Arts (120 ECTS credits) in the main field of study. In the main fields Romance Languages and Classical Languages, which contain specialisations, the degree will be in the selected specialisation. It is possible to graduate with a Degree of Master of Arts (60 ECTS credits) as an intermediate exit point in those main study areas/specialisations that indicate it.

### **Misc**

Transitional regulations:

When the Programme Education Plan is discontinued, students have a right to complete their education according to this syllabus during a transitional period corresponding to the two-year duration of the programme plus another two years. During this period, primarily, the limitations stated in the plans for the individual courses within the programme still apply; secondarily, equivalent courses will be offered.
