Course content

This course introduces the growing body of research that interrelates Asian Studies and Queer Studies. It highlights gender and sexual diversity in both modern and pre-modern East Asian settings, and it investigates the related fluid identities primarily through examples from literature, the performing arts, art history, and popular media. In doing so, the course investigates the cultural particularities of apparently similar transnational phenomena, while undermining essentialist determinism and the predominance of modern Western models.

Learning outcomes

After having completed the course, students are expected to be able to:

• give an overview of English-language research that interrelates Asian Studies and Queer Studies

• explain different conceptions of "Asia" with regard to "queer" issues

• discuss specific cases of arts and culture in East Asia from the perspective of queer sexualities and genders.

• give an account of cultural and social particularities of queer identities in different periods of East Asian history.

Education

Instruction is given in the form of lectures and seminars.

Attendance at all teaching sessions is mandatory.

The language of instruction is English and is conducted mainly on line via Zoom.

Forms of examination

a. The course examined on the basis of a digital home exam by the end of the course.

If a student has a certificate regarding particular pedagogical assistance due to a disability the examiner has the right to give an adapted examination or to permit the student to conduct the examination in an alternative way.

b. Grades will be set according to a seven-point scale related to the learning objectives of the course:

- A = Excellent,
- B = Very good,
- C = Good,
- D = Satisfactory,
- E = Adequate,
- Fx = Inadequate,
- F = Totally inadequate.

c. Students will be informed of the written grading criteria when the course starts. The criterion-referenced grading criteria are binding.

d. In order to pass the course, students must receive a grade of E or higher on the examinations, and meet the attendance requirement of 80%. Under special circumstances, the examiner may, after consulting with the coordinating teacher, grant the student an exemption from the obligation of mandatory attendance. The student can then be assigned a compensatory assignment.

e. At least two examination opportunities should be offered for each course instance. At least one examination opportunity should be offered during a semester when the course is not given.

Students who receive the grade E or higher may not retake the examination to attain a higher grade.

Students who have received the grade Fx or F twice by the same examiner are entitled to have another examiner appointed for the next examination, unless there are special reasons to contrary. Such requests should be made to the department board.

f. This course does not include any opportunities to complete a supplementary assignment in order to convert the grade Fx into a passing grade.

Interim

When the syllabus is discontinued, students have the right to be examined according to this syllabus once per semester during a transition period of three semesters.

Limitations

This course may not be included in a degree together with a course, taken in Sweden or elsewhere, of identical or partially similar content.
