## Decision

The course syllabus has been confirmed by the Department of Slavic and Baltic Studies, Finnish, Dutch and German.

## Prerequisites and special admittance requirements

Lithuanian Language Proficiency II, 7.5 credits, alternatively Lithuanian Language Proficiency A, 7.5 credits, and Lithuanian Language Proficiency B, 7.5 credits (a part of Lithuanian I, 30 credits)

## Course content

The course covers Lithuanian grammar corresponding to the CEFRL level A2.1, and provides both theoretical knowledge about the Lithuanian language and practical language skills for oral and written everyday communication.

## Learning outcomes

Upon completion of the course the student will have shown an ability to

- identify and analyze grammatical structures in Lithuanian texts corresponding to the CEFRL level A2.1
- translate texts to Lithuanian, with the use of aids, corresponding to the CEFRL level A2.1
- carry on a conversation in Lithuanian in everyday situations
- express oneself in writing in Lithuanian in everyday situations

## Education

Instruction consists of lectures and seminars. Compulsory course requirements: participation in discussions and seminars on campus or online via the university teaching platform or other online channel. Assignment submission deadlines are a compulsory part of the course. Completion of the compulsory assignments are obligatory in order to participate in subsequent examinations.

The language of instruction is English.

Instruction takes place on-line or on campus according to each respective course instance.

More detailed information can be found in the course description.

The course description is available a month before the start of the course at the latest.

### **Forms of examination**

a. The following methods of examination are used: submitted assignments and participation in discussions and seminars. Continual examination takes place through one written assignment submission in connection with each respective seminar. The basis for weighting the separate examination assignments is explained in the grading criteria. The examination takes place in English. More detailed information can be found in the course description.

The course description is available at latest one month before the start of the course.

If the student has a certificate recommending special pedagogical aid due to functional variance, the examiner has the right to adapt the examination or give an alternative examination to the student.

b. Grades will be set according to a seven-point scale related to the learning objectives of the course: A=Excellent, B=Very Good, C=Good, D=Satisfactory, E=Adequate, Fx=Fail, some additional work required, F=Fail, much additional work required.

c. The grading criteria will be distributed at the beginning of the course. The announced criterion-referenced grading criteria are binding.

d. In order to pass the course, a grade of at least E on all examination assignments is required, as well as completed compulsory assignments. The completion of course requirements is obligatory in order to be able to participate in the subsequent examination. Examination assignments that are not submitted on time are graded C at most.

A course unit that has been credit transferred should be included in the weighting for a final grade.

e. For each course instance, normally at least three examination opportunities are offered within one year. At least one examination opportunity will be offered during a year when the course is not given.

A student who has received the grade of Fx or F twice on a given examination and by the same examiner can, on application, be granted another examiner at the subsequent examination, unless there are special reasons on the contrary. The application should be addressed to the department board.

A student who has received a grade of E or higher may not retake the examination to attain a higher grade.

f. There is no facility to improve the grade Fx to a pass grade in this course.

### **Interim**

When the course is no longer offered, the student has the right to be examined according to this course syllabus once per semester for a three-semester winding-up period.

### **Limitations**

This course can be included in a Bachelors degree together with other approved courses attended domestically or abroad, whose content wholly or partially is congruent with the contents of this course.
