Course content

In this course students practice text comprehension, translation of literary and non-literary texts from Dutch into Swedish, and pronunciation.

This course could be useful for teachers, postgraduates from different faculties and persons working in trade and industry as well as with culture.

Learning outcomes

On completion of this course students should be able to understand literary and non-literary texts with the help of grammar books and dictionaries.

Education

Teaching hours are dependent on available resources. Decisions regarding teaching plans and compulsory attendance are taken by the department board.

Forms of examination

- The methods of examination are decided by the department board.
- Grades are given according to a criterion referenced seven-point scale:

A = Excellent
B = Very Good
C = Good

D = Satisfactory
E = Adequate
Fx = Insufficient
F = Fail

c. The grading criteria for this course are to be distributed at the beginning of the course.

d.-

e. In order to obtain at least a grade of E, a student who has received an F or Fx has the right to an additional four tests provided the course is still offered. A student who has received a grade of E or higher may not take the test again in order to get a higher grade. A student who has received the grade of Fx or F twice on a given test and by the same examiner can, on application, be granted a new examiner, unless there are specific reasons against it. The application should be addressed to the board of the department.

Interim

When the course is no longer offered or its contents have been essentially revised, the student has the right to be examined according to this course syllabus once per semester for a three-semester period. However, the restrictions above under e still hold. For comparisons with the previous course system the department's student counsellor should be contacted.

Limitations

This course cannot be included in a degree together with a course, taken in Sweden or elsewhere, of identical or partially similar content.
