Course content

The course consists of the following modules:

- 1. Grammar and Reading Texts
- 2. Oral Proficiency

Learning outcomes

Having completed the course the student will have shown an ability to:

- acquire elementary skills in the grammar of the German language
- read simpler German texts
- report and discuss the contents of simpler German texts

Education

Education will take place in the shape of lectures and group exercises.

The form and the extent of teaching may be adapted to both the number of students in the course and the economic situation of the department.

Forms of examination

a. The following method/s of examination is/are used: obligatory presence with active participation and handin assignments.

The method of examination may be adapted to both the number of students in the course as the economic

situation of the department.

b. Grades are given according to a criterion referenced seven-point scale:

A = Excellent

B = Very Good

C = Good

D = Satisfactory

E = Adequate

F = Insufficient

Fx = Fail

- c. The grading criteria for this course are to be distributed at the beginning of the course.
- d. A grade of at least E is required on all modules which are graded according to the seven-point scale.
- e. In order to obtain at least a grade of E, a student who has received an F or Fx has the right to an additional four tests provided the course is still offered. A student who has received a grade of E or higher may not take the test again in order to get a higher grade.

A student who has received the grade of F or Fx twice on a given test and by the same examiner can, on application, be granted a new examiner, unless there are specific reasons against it. The application should be addressed to the board of the department.

Regulations for transition

When the course is no longer offered or its contents have been essentially revised, the student has the right to be examined according to this course syllabus once per semester for a three-semester period. However, restrictions mentioned above under e still hold.
